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The Opportunity



Murray State University is seeking an innovative and forward-thinking **Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs** to partner with President Ron Patterson in shaping the University's future. As Murray State enters a new era of leadership, the Provost will play a pivotal role in advancing academic excellence, expanding opportunity, and ensuring that Murray State continues to serve as a regional leader in higher education. This is an exciting time for Murray State University, with \$200 million in capital projects allocated toward new facilities, including a School of Nursing and Health Professions Building, Veterinary Sciences building, and Learning Commons/Residence Hall.

The Provost serves as the University's chief academic officer and provides vision, leadership, and strategic oversight for all areas of Academic Affairs. This includes guiding academic programs, advancing research and creative activity, supporting faculty development, strengthening student success, and stewarding academic budgets and resources. The Provost will be expected to foster a culture of collaboration and innovation, working closely with faculty, staff, students, and external partners to build on Murray State's proud tradition while positioning the University to thrive in a rapidly evolving higher education landscape.

The portfolio of Academic Affairs is broad and dynamic, encompassing the Colleges of Business; Education and Human Services; Humanities and Fine Arts; Science, Engineering and Technology; the School of Agriculture; and the School of Nursing and Health Professions. Additional areas of responsibility include the Center for Adult and Regional Education, University Libraries, Faculty Development Center, Honors College, Institutional Effectiveness, Institutional Review Board, McNair Scholars, Office of the Registrar, Office of Sponsored Programs, and Undergraduate Research and Scholarly Activities. Through these units, the Provost will champion academic innovation, new program development, and a commitment to high-impact practices that prepare students for meaningful careers and engaged citizenship.

The next Provost will be a visible and trusted leader who values transparency, cultivates strong relationships, and brings fresh ideas to advance Murray State's mission. With the momentum of new presidential leadership, this is a defining opportunity to shape the academic enterprise, expand access, and deliver transformative educational experiences that meet the needs of today's students and tomorrow's communities.





Opportunities and Expectations

Champion relational and collaborative leadership

— Murray State seeks a Provost who leads by building trust, fostering collaboration, and engaging authentically with faculty, staff, students, and community partners. As the University enters a new era of innovation and growth under President Ron Patterson, the Provost will play a vital role in uniting stakeholders around a shared vision for academic excellence.

Academic program development and portfolio management

— The Provost will be an experienced academic leader with a demonstrated ability to manage and grow a complex academic portfolio. This includes leading the development of new programs, supporting continuous improvement in existing offerings, and ensuring that the University's academic programs align with workforce needs and strategic priorities.

Accreditation and professional program leadership

— Murray State is expanding its impact with the launch of new professional programs in dental hygiene and veterinary medicine, both of which require specialized accreditations. The Provost will provide leadership in shepherding these programs through the accreditation process, supporting the work of recently hired founding deans, and guiding the selection of an additional founding dean. With several other programs under review, the Provost must bring direct experience and

proven success in accreditation and program approval processes. The next Provost will also oversee compliance and accreditation for the University broadly, including ensuring the continued strength of institutional accreditation.

 **Faculty and student success** — The Provost will foster a supportive environment that empowers faculty and staff to thrive in teaching, research, and service, while ensuring students receive a high-quality education and transformative academic experience. Faculty recruitment, retention, and professional development will remain key priorities.

 **Budget stewardship and resource alignment** — The Provost will be a skilled manager of resources with strong financial acumen. Partnering with University leadership, the Provost will oversee academic budgets, align resources with strategic priorities, and ensure fiscal accountability across all academic units.

 **Change leadership** — Murray State is in a period of transformation, with new programs, leadership, and opportunities on the horizon. The Provost must be an adaptable leader capable of managing change effectively, balancing innovation with stability, and leading the academic community through transitions with clarity and confidence.

- A Terminal degree (e.g., Ph.D., Ed.D., or appropriate terminal degree) from an accredited institution.
- A Scholarly record (peer-reviewed publications/creative activity) commensurate with appointment at the rank of full professor with tenure in an academic department.
- A relational and collaborative leader who listens, communicates effectively, and inspires trust.
- Minimum of five years of academic administrative experience with responsibility for program development, accreditation, and budget oversight; direct experience with professional program accreditation strongly preferred.
- Demonstrated success in managing complex academic portfolios and leading change with positive outcomes.
- Deep commitment to academic excellence, student success, and faculty development.
- Strong financial skills and proven ability to align resources with institutional priorities.
- Evidence of transparent and inclusive decision making that engages faculty, staff, and students.
- Experience hiring, supporting, and mentoring academic leaders, including deans and senior administrators.
- A proven track record of advancing new academic initiatives, securing program approvals, and managing accreditation processes.
- Personal qualities of integrity, empathy, adaptability, and optimism.
- Commitment to Murray State's mission of access, innovation, and service to the region and beyond.

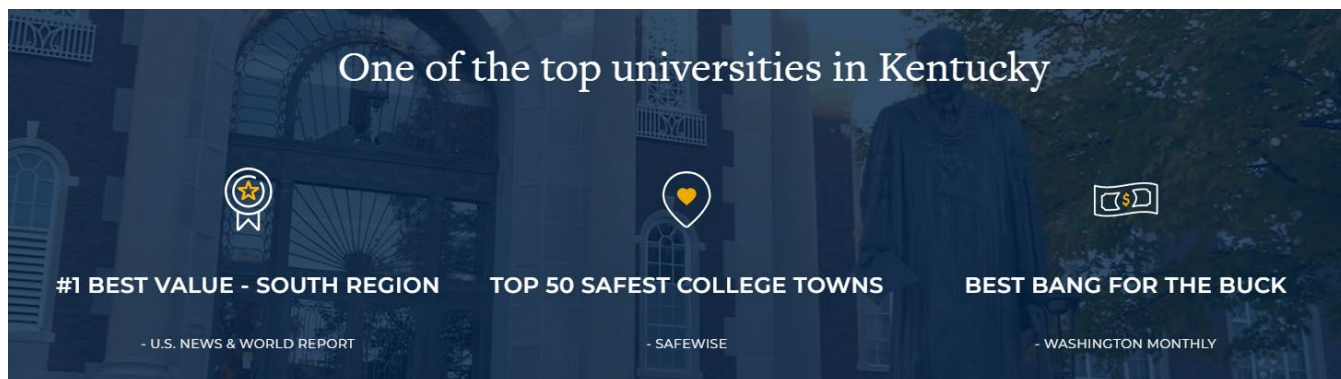
