THE OPPORTUNITY: A CHALLENGE FOR LEADERSHIP

The University of Kentucky (UK) College of Health Sciences (CHS) invites nominations, inquiries and applications for its next Dean. The university is quickly raising its profile as a top-tier public research university. As a land-grant institution located in the beautiful Bluegrass region of central Kentucky, UK is the flagship public research institution among the higher education institutions of the state. The <u>College of Health Sciences</u> is one of the oldest and most innovative health science colleges in the country, founded in 1966 among the first 13 health science charter schools.

The college offers a variety of undergraduate and graduate degrees, as well as minor and certificate options, and a Ph.D. program in Rehabilitation and Health Sciences, to more than 1,700 undergraduate and graduate students. It is divided into five departments — Athletic Training and Clinical Nutrition, Communication Sciences and Disorders, Health and Clinical Sciences, Physical Therapy and Physician Assistant Studies.

The college is dedicated to educating frontline, entry-level practitioners for its health science disciplines, as well as the clinical, educational and research leaders of tomorrow. Its mission is to address health challenges facing communities and populations, particularly in Kentucky, through teaching, research and service.

The dean's position will offer an opportunity to guide one of the university's most important academic units at a pivotal moment in its growth, as it strengthens ties across health disciplines, enhances educational infrastructure and expands its role in the Commonwealth's health ecosystem.

However, there is an expanded responsibility in this opening. As a state, Kentucky is facing a critical shortage of health care professionals. Overall, Kentucky ranked 44th in Annual Report. In the poorest areas of the state, the death rates from heart disease, cancer, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, stroke and diabetes are all at least 10% higher than the national average.

The new dean will take on this responsibility, equipped to succeed. The college is set to be a key occupant of the <u>Michael D. Rankin MD Health Education Building (RHEB)</u>, a 520,000-plus-square-foot facility currently under construction and scheduled for completion in 2027. RHEB will house four colleges — Health Sciences, Medicine, Nursing and Public Health — alongside the Center for

Interprofessional and Community Health Education. This interdisciplinary environment is designed to stimulate further student growth in alignment with the state's health care workforce needs, foster collaboration across disciplines, modernize health training programs and expand clinical simulation capabilities. It will support the integration of academic, clinical and research experiences in ways that match the evolving nature of health professions.

The construction is supported by a transformative anchor gift and \$250 million



in support from the Kentucky Legislature in 2022. The building is scheduled to open in mid-2027. (More information about the project can be found at https://provost.uky.edu/HEB.)

The dean will be responsible for the overall supervision and direction of the college, provide strong leadership in the advancement of the college's educational, research and service missions, manage its financial and human resources, promote excellence among faculty and staff and play an important role in fundraising and alumni relations. As chief academic officer of the college, the dean reports directly to the provost. Qualifications for this position include a record of scholarly achievement, leadership experience in personnel and budgetary administration, an earned doctorate and qualifications commensurate with tenure at the rank of professor in the college.

CHS also maintains deep and essential partnerships with <u>UK HealthCare</u>, the university's nationally ranked academic medical system. UK HealthCare includes the Albert B. Chandler Hospital, Kentucky Children's Hospital and a comprehensive network of regional hospitals, specialized outpatient clinics and services. These facilities offer CHS students access to rich clinical experiences, interprofessional education and translational research opportunities that directly benefit the health of Kentucky's communities.

Here in Kentucky, we deeply love our communities. UK is located in Lexington, Kentucky (Fayette



County), in the heart of the Bluegrass region. The community has a population of more than 323,000 with a larger metro area of more than 517,000 and is home to numerous businesses in the computer industry, health care services, auto manufacturing, banking, financial management and investment services and Lexington is also known as the horse capital of the world. Its historic downtown and horse farms, excellent countywide

public school system, convenient airport and growing downtown cultural activities contribute to its appeal. It is approximately 70 miles from Cincinnati and Louisville.

Like the region, over the past 10 years, the college and university have experienced a significant amount of growth. In the next decade, the University of Kentucky aims to become nationally synonymous with health care — and an even more premier destination for health care students across the country. It goes without saying that the College of Health Sciences will help lead that charge.

UK seeks someone who is ready to help show the world just where the next great generation of health care leaders will be educated — which will, in turn, continue to help the people of Kentucky and beyond.

ROLE OF THE DEAN

The CHS dean serves as the chief academic officer, administrative officer and spokesperson for the college. Reporting directly to the provost, the dean holds a tenured faculty rank (professor) while providing strong and visionary leadership and strategic direction for the academic departments, programs and initiatives within a complex fiscal environment. The dean ensures the college's academic, research and service missions are achieved and that the college is well-positioned to address evolving challenges and opportunities within the health sciences disciplines. The dean will also support and strengthen essential partnerships with UK HealthCare, the university's nationally ranked academic medical system, which includes the Albert B. Chandler Hospital, Kentucky Children's Hospital and a comprehensive network of specialized outpatient clinics and services.

With a demonstrated commitment to teaching, scholarship, research productivity and service, the dean will be a recognized scholar with both a national and international profile who can amplify the visibility and reputation of the College of Health Sciences at the University of Kentucky.

Responsibilities

- Identify and establish fundraising priorities and secure gifts from alumni, corporations, foundations and/or supporters.
- ▲ Lead critical partnerships within the university's health care system and UK HealthCare.
- ♣ Allocate college resources, including faculty, staff, financial resources, space, furniture and equipment.
- Schedule and preside over CHS Executive Council meetings; set agenda in consultation with administrators and Faculty Council.
- Appoint CHS Promotion and Tenure Committee (in consultation with the college's Faculty Council), Appeals Committee and ad hoc committees.
- Consult on risk management issues (e.g., FERPA, sexual harassment, discrimination, HIPAA, etc.).
- → Foster an environment of shared governance by building relations with all campus communities while shepherding a culture of collaboration.
- Lead the development and implementation of a strategy that will position the college as among the highest rated in the country for extramurally funded research, in conjunction with the vice president for research.
- Make recommendations on appointments, reappointments, terminal appointments, decisions not to reappoint, post-retirement appointments, promotions, granting of tenure, salaries and salary changes for members of the college or for ultimate action thereon when such authority has been delegated by the president or provost.
- Conduct periodic reviews of academic units relative to their missions, administration and finances and make recommendations for improving their performance as outlined in the Administrative Regulations.

Responsibilities (cont.)

- Serve as a chief administrative officer for the college. The dean will be expected to meet regularly with the provost for both individual meetings and as part of regular meetings with the other deans.
- ♣ Assume such other duties and responsibilities as may be requested by the provost.

Goals and Objectives

The next dean of the College of Health Sciences will step into an exceptional leadership opportunity. Among the responsibilities assigned to this position, the dean is expected to give particular attention to the following leadership goals:

- Articulating and implementing a strategic plan to support the mission of the college and the university, whose goal is to help the people of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and beyond attain the highest level of health possible.
- In alignment with the university's strategic plan, the dean will be expected to engage faculty, staff, students and partners to develop clear strategic priorities to move the college forward. This includes developing future leaders of the health sciences workforce, advancing innovation and health sciences practice and serving as a connector with health sciences partners across Kentucky, the nation and the world.
- ♣ Leveraging community engagement and team science to promote research growth.
- The dean will also help the college maintain essential partnerships with UK HealthCare, the university's nationally ranked academic medical system. UK HealthCare includes the Albert B. Chandler Hospital, Kentucky Children's Hospital, Eastern State Hospital, UK St. Claire, UK King's Daughters and a comprehensive network of specialized outpatient clinics and services.
- ♣ The College of Health Sciences is part of a world-class teaching and research university, serving the Commonwealth as the flagship, land-grant institution. UK is also a comprehensive campus with all colleges, schools and libraries co-located. The new RHEB will increase the proximity even more and expertise and partners will be closely positioned in the College of Health Sciences to broaden impact by growing powerful interdisciplinary programs, teams and collaborations.
- Being visible and involved in advancement opportunities.
- As a key leader within the university and with the construction of the new RHEB, the next dean will play a key role in fundraising and advancement opportunities. The need to raise money will remain constant. It will require dedicated and strategic time by the dean. Fundraising efforts will include working with the university's Office of Philanthropy and Alumni Engagement in formulating and implementing a philanthropic and development strategy that supports the college's research, education, scholarship, capital and long-term needs.

PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS & PERSONAL QUALITIES

The successful candidate will be an experienced, entrepreneurial, creative and collaborative leader with a deep appreciation for the scholarly and practical importance of the disciplines and professions within the College of Health Sciences. The dean will be committed to developing and promoting the gateway to the health sciences. Fundraising efforts will include working with the university's Office of Philanthropy and Alumni Engagement in formulating and implementing a philanthropic and development strategy that supports the college's research, education, scholarship, capital and long-term needs.

The dean will recruit, retain and lead a strong community of students from different backgrounds and perspectives, as well as faculty and staff, to achieve this goal. The dean will continue to nurture and prioritize interpersonal and professional relationships within the college and cultivate these beyond the college. The dean will lead efforts to enhance the college's national and international visibility and reputation.

- Ph.D. or equivalent degree.
- Nationally recognized achievement in academic pursuits that would warrant appointment as a tenured, full professor.
- Progressive and broad academic administrative leadership experience arising from a senior-level administrative role such as department chair, center director, associate dean or dean.
- ♣ Evidence of innovation in the classroom with demonstrated undergraduate and graduate teaching excellence.
- → Distinguished record of extramural funding and scholarship aligned with the College of Health Sciences' robust program in research and scholarship.
- Ability to build partnerships and collaborate with external stakeholders, government agencies and health science partners to support the tri-part mission of teaching, research and service.

- ♣ A successful academic administrative leadership record that demonstrates compelling evidence of capacity to manage the college.
- ♣ An ability to develop and fulfill the college's land-grant mission through building a shared collaborative vision.

- Values collaborative engagement and actively seeks opportunities to connect with a broad range of institutional and external partners to support the college's mission.

THE COLLEGE OF HEALTH SCIENCES

The College of Health Sciences, originally called the College of Allied Health Professions, was one of the first 13 charter schools for allied health formed following the passage of the Allied Health Professions Personnel Training Act of 1966. Since then, the UK College of Health Sciences remains a leader in graduate education and research. The College of Health Sciences is also among the first colleges within the University of Kentucky system to have a complete distance learning degree program. The college began educating Physical Therapy students at the UK Center of Excellence in Rural Health in Hazard, Kentucky, in 1992 and Physician Assistant students in Morehead, Kentucky, in 1996. More recently, the Medical Laboratory Science program was re-established to educate students at the center in Hazard.

Educational Programs and Departments

The College of Health Sciences has five academic departments with varying degrees and specializations, as well as the Rehabilitation and Health Sciences Ph.D. program.

Athletic Training and Clinical Nutrition

The department includes the <u>Athletic Training</u> (AT) and <u>Clinical Nutrition</u> programs. It is committed to advancing innovative research, teaching and service alongside the students and communities it serves. It is committed to effectively preparing entry-level athletic trainers by

providing a variety of educational, scholarly, clinical and service opportunities. The AT Professional Master of Science program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education. It also offers a graduate certificate in Musculoskeletal Injury Management and a degree program pathway in the undergraduate Health and Human Sciences degree.

The interdisciplinary Nutritional Sciences program enables students in its doctorate and Master of Science programs to learn and receive research guidance from 28



departments and divisions across the university's Colleges of Arts and Sciences, Education, Health Sciences, Medicine, Nursing and Pharmacy and the Martin-Gatton College of Agriculture, Food and Environment.

Communication Sciences and Disorders

The Department of <u>Communication Sciences and Disorders</u> (CSD) offers undergraduate and graduate programs in speech-language pathology. Its mission is to serve citizens from all backgrounds in Kentucky and beyond by preparing graduates with the knowledge and skills needed to provide quality clinical services. These programs prepare students to also seek advanced degrees in fields spanning the sciences underlying speech, language and hearing. The graduate program is accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association.

A new Doctorate in Audiology program will be implemented in spring 2026. This collaboration,



with the UK Department of Otolaryngology and Audiology in the College of Medicine, plans to start faculty position searches in Fall 2025 and enroll students in Summer 2026.

The department is also home to the CSD Academic Clinic and the UK Voice and Swallow Clinic.

Health and Clinical Sciences

The Department of Health and Clinical Sciences is composed of three undergraduate programs (<u>Clinical Leadership and Management</u>, <u>Human Health Sciences</u> and <u>Medical Laboratory Science</u>), a <u>Clinical Healthcare Management Certificate</u> and a <u>Minor in Health Advocacy</u>. All programs provide graduates with the expertise needed to meet the health needs of Kentucky

and beyond as future health care administrators and prepare them to pursue advanced degree programs in medicine, dentistry, pharmacy, physician assistant studies, athletic training, physical therapy, occupational therapy, optometry, medical research and more. The Medical Laboratory Science program is accredited by the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences. It also has a secondary campus at the Center for Health Education and Research in Morehead, Kentucky.



Physical Therapy

The <u>Department of Physical Therapy</u> strives to meet the physical therapy needs of Kentucky



to contribute to global needs. They do this through scholarship, research, creative activities, public service and professional socialization. The department has two campuses — one in Lexington and one at the Center of Excellence in Rural Health in Hazard, Kentucky. The program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education.

The department is also home to the <u>Samaritan's Touch Clinic</u>.

Physician Assistant Studies

The <u>Department of Physician Assistant Studies</u> is dedicated to improving the health of communities by increasing access to care through training physician assistant leaders. The department has two campus locations — one in Lexington, Kentucky, and one at the Center for Health Education and Research in Morehead, Kentucky. The program is accredited by the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant.

The department also offers an <u>Academic Residency Program</u> that develops physician assistant leaders through clinical training and opportunities to lead, teach and research. This residency program offers eight tracks/specialties across five health care facilities throughout the state of Kentucky.

And the <u>Rehabilitation and Health Sciences Ph.D.</u>

<u>Program</u> provides students with the distinctive

opportunity to study with faculty from the different health professions offered in participating institutions, such as athletic training, communication science and disorders, occupational therapy, clinical nutrition, physical therapy, physician assistant studies and health services research, as well as take courses from faculty specialized in these disciplines.

Distance technologies are used to deliver some portions of the program, thus making it more accessible. However, all classes are taken in real time, and the program is not offered online.

Quality and Rankings

The College of Health Sciences has achieved recognition in several regional and national rankings.

- In the U.S. News & World Report rankings, for example, the Physician Assistant Studies program is ranked 35th nationally, while the Physical Therapy program is ranked 22nd and the Speech Language Pathology program is ranked 39th.
- According to Course Advisor, CHS has the No. 1 ranked <u>Medical Laboratory Science</u> program in the state.
- <u>Human Health Sciences</u> ranked 58th on College Factual's Best Schools for Health Science list, as well as No. 1 in the state.

Research and Scholarship

Research is central to the college's mission. The College of Health Sciences is proud to support a thriving research program, with a current portfolio of extramurally sponsored funding of more than \$44.7 million. Three research objectives help to drive the college:

- 1. Draw upon our research strengths to promote health and well-being and address sources of disability and chronic conditions in Kentucky, the nation and globally to bring about greater well-being and prosperity;
- 2. Advance a culture of innovation and collaboration in research and creative work that integrates disciplines and promotes translation from the bench to the clinic to address local, national and international challenges; and
- 3. Promote an agile research program that supports established and emerging areas of strength within the College of Health Sciences and is impactful, self-sustaining and efficient in addressing the most pressing challenges facing our local, national and global communities.

Research programs are built on passion, purpose and creating accessible pathways for healthier lives. Transformative research happens through engaging communities and

translating discovery into practice. Through collaboration and innovation, the College of Health Sciences advances methodology and practice as the catalyst of positive change.

Researchers in the College of Health Sciences lead initiatives and collaborate in transdisciplinary discovery across the university. Specifically, the College of Health Sciences has two university-recognized multi-disciplinary research centers:

- Center for Muscle Biology
- Sports Medicine Research Institute

With a population of roughly 323,000, anchoring a metropolitan area of more than 517,000 people, Lexington offers both the warmth and hospitality of a small city, alongside the amenities typically found in a large city. Lexington describes itself as having "a fortified economy, strong in manufacturing, technology and entrepreneurial support, benefiting from a diverse, balanced business base." Leading employers in the metro region include Amazon, IBM, Lexmark, Lockheed-Martin, Toyota and UPS. Lexington also has a convenient regional airport.

Lexington is also home to great sporting traditions, including horse racing and Kentucky Wildcat basketball and football. In the spring and fall, one can spend a beautiful afternoon watching thoroughbred racing at Keeneland, which hosted the Breeders' Cup in 2022 and looks to host again in 2026. The Kentucky Derby, run in nearby Louisville, is known as one of the world's premier racing events. The region also boasts excellent parks and natural wonders, including Red River Gorge and Mammoth Cave, the longest underground cave system in the world.

The food scene is filled with Kentucky originals, southern classics and creative fusion. City residents benefit from a great local farm-to-table food environment with re-imagined southern staples coupled with inventive bourbon-infused creations. In the heart of Bourbon Country, one of Lexington's most exciting hotspots, the Distillery District, offers creative cuisine, craft beers, local bourbons and premium ice cream on a revitalized 25-acre historic property.
