The Opportunity

West Virginia University (WVU) invites nominations and applications for a strategic and innovative thinker to serve as the Dean of Libraries and Press. As a land-grant institution, WVU seeks an inspirational leader who understands WVU's commitment to its land-grant mission and the vital role WVU plays in the state and who can strategically build on the foundations laid by the retiring dean to shape the future of the Libraries and the Mountaineer family and community at large.

The Dean of Libraries and Press at WVU should be an accomplished and visionary leader. Reporting to the provost, the dean is the chief administrator responsible for strategic leadership of the University Libraries, the West Virginia & Regional History Center, the William A. Neal Museum of the Health Sciences, the WVU Humanities Center, and the WVU Press. This role involves managing resources, collections, staff, technology, and facilities to support the university's teaching, research, and land grant missions. Key duties include advocating for the Libraries, understanding and advocating for the role of university presses, and of WVU Press specifically, in fostering engagement with global communities of scholars and creative artists, and contributing to the broader culture through its scholarly and creative output, fostering and driving innovation and collaboration in the delivery of resources and services across all campuses, and leading fundraising efforts to enhance the Libraries' role as an intellectual hub and to enhance the WVU efforts to publish important work that requires additional financial support.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Provide strategic, forward-thinking leadership to effectively set priorities, manage resources and programs, and achieve institutional goals;
- Establish a shared vision that promotes the University's and the Libraries' missions;
- Develop and implement a strategic road map to advance that vision;
- Facilitate the continuing organizational restructuring that is ongoing in the Libraries, building a culture that values inquiry and innovation, leverages its strengths, and works collaboratively in service to the betterment of the University;
- Collaborate creatively across campus and beyond to advance the Libraries' mission and role as a thought partner, building alliances to support and enhance the evolving needs of researchers, educators, students, users, and innovators;
- Oversee the Libraries' budget and cultivate relationships with alumnae donors and outside partners to support the Libraries' fundraising and development efforts;
- Promote the Libraries at campus, state, national, and international levels:
- Direct the recruitment, development, and retention of talented library staff, and create a collaborative library environment.
- Grow the financial and organizational capacities of the Libraries, Press, Museum, and Humanities Center through an active fundraising portfolio;
- Continue the transformation of WVU Libraries into a robust research library that supports
 research and academic excellence through expert staff, excellent collections, evolving
 support of scholarly communication, and technological advancement that meets the
 needs of the University
- Lead library Assistant and Associate Deans, Director of the Press and Director of the Humanities Center, the Director of Development, Strategic Business Advisor, and Administrative Assistant

- M.L.S. or equivalent degree from an ALA-accredited institution.
- Minimum 7 years of progressive leadership experience in library administration

- Proven leadership in program management and interdisciplinary collaboration in a complex research university setting.
- Commitment to the educational role of academic libraries, and alignment of library activities and curricula, information literacy, and research.

- Evidence of success in securing external funding.
- Ability to analyze complex problems, interpret operational needs, and develop creative solutions.
- Works with library assistants and associate deans and department heads, as well as
 external sources, to identify, evaluate, and implement programs that improve services
 and facilities, enhance the quality of resources, and increase operational efficiency
 within the libraries.
- Functions as the chief fiscal officer and provides clear communication about the budget.
- Ability to coach, guide, and delegate authority to others for specific administrative tasks.
- Creates an environment that supports professional growth.
- Fosters professionalism, open dialogue, transparency, and a positive and respectful work/learning environment.
- Advanced verbal and written communication skills and the ability to present effectively to small and large groups.

About the Libraries

The WVU Libraries encompasses seven libraries: the Downtown Campus Library, Evansdale



Library, Health Sciences Library (Morgantown), Law Library, Health Sciences Library (Charleston), Mary F. Shipper Library at Potomac State College, and Beckley Library at WVU Institute of Technology. Their collections include more than 1.8 million books, 400,000 eBooks, and 117,000 eJournals. The West Virginia & Regional History Center is the archives and special collections at WVU Libraries and holds over 20,000 linear feet of collections and over 100,000 books that document the unique history and culture of West Virginia and central Appalachia. WVU Libraries also houses distinguished centers and programs, including Art in the Libraries, the William A. Neal Museum of the Health Sciences, WVU Humanities Center, and WVU Press.
