The next Provost must work closely with the deans, faculty, staff, and administration to build on the University's commitment to its access mission by expanding higher education opportunities for all student populations.

With more than 300 associate's, bachelor's, master's, PhD, or professional degrees — plus WVU Online along with a growing number of other educational learning opportunities — the Provost must ensure the University's academic programs will help students gain the skillsets and knowledge to meet evolving workforce demands.


Above all, the next Provost must continue to support faculty and students, delivering exemplary support for faculty and instructors while providing students with a high-quality education and academic experience.

- The promise of a land-grant research **university** — As an R1, land-grant institution, WVU holds a special responsibility to ensure the well-being of the entire state through Extension services, its branch campuses, and its research portfolio. Committed to faculty and student success, the Provost will champion excellence in teaching, service, and research. To do this effectively, the Provost will ensure that faculty have shared governance and are resourced with modern systems, organizational structures, and clear accountability measures that will enable them to excel in their profession.
- Academic programs The Provost will lead in allocating resources and assessing programs to ensure continuous improvements to the University's academic programs and research portfolio. The Provost will identify opportunities for program growth and promote the development of innovative academic programming and interdisciplinary initiatives to better meet the needs of students and the state.
- Retention and student success It will be imperative for the new Provost to ensure effective leadership, direction, and accountability of University efforts to recruit and retain outstanding students, faculty, and staff. Within an environment of declining high school graduates, the Provost will lead efforts to continue the recent record of success in student retention, persistence, and degree completion.

- Research The Provost will foster collaboration across the institution to strengthen the University's reputation as an internationally recognized research institution with the highest Carnegie research classification. The Provost will partner with the Research Office to adapt to the evolving research enterprise, maintaining an environment that attracts talented graduate students and supports successful research programs.
- Academic budget The next Provost will collaborate with stakeholders to inform the University's academic budget and budget model. The Provost will partner with leadership to help determine the allocation of resources across the academic spectrum to support excellence in teaching, research, and service.



Though the Provost does not oversee the WVU Health Sciences Center (HSC) or its schools, it is important to note the critical role that HSC plays in our community and across the region in teaching the next generation of healthcare professionals, conducting innovative research, and providing patient-centered care.

SOME MAJOR DIFFERENTIATORS

WVU is investing in academic majors that serve our students' interests while meeting the workforce demands of our state, region, and evolving world. While we offer 300+ majors for our bachelor's, master's and professional programs, here are a few standouts.

ROBOTICS ENGINEERING

Our student robotics team has a history of success in international competitions, including winning the best in the world in 2022-23, surpassing 104 teams from 15 countries, to build the next generation of Mars rovers. The team has maintained a competitive edge over the past 2 years placing second both times.

Home to 12 robotics research labs, the new robotics major in the Statler College of Engineering and Mineral Resources prepares students to design advanced robots in one of the world's fastest-growing fields. This major is supported by a \$1 million NASA grant to equip a new state-of-the-art lab with robots. As the program has grown, so have the number of WVU international competition teams including RoboCup, F1Tenth, and VEX Robotics team.



CYBERSECURITY

Our cyber programs address a high-growth area in the job market. Students engage in real-world experiential activities and contracting work with our many business, government, and defense-industry partners.

MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS

MIS students in the Chambers College of Business and Economics use computer technology, data analytics, artificial intelligence, and machine learning to analyze business challenges and develop organizational solutions. This high-demand major is matched with high-growth opportunity in the job market.

FORENSIC SCIENCES

A magnet major within the Eberly College of Arts and Sciences, the forensic programs draw students from around the country and world since we are 1 of only 2 in the U.S. to offer bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees. With the largest crime scene training complex in the country and the FBI's lead academic partner, students have access to state-of-the-art facilities and equipment, work with world-class faculty, and get real-world experiences with an emphasis on internships.

GAME DESIGN AND INTERACTIVE MEDIA

This new degree in the College of Creative Arts and Media teaches students to create interactive audiovisual media for mobile apps, video games, and other platforms. With a focus on hands-on learning and real-world projects, students can publish original games, preparing them for careers in a fast-evolving job market.

NURSING

Our undergraduate nursing programs are among our largest and most successful, with nearly perfect pass rates on national licensure exams. Enrollment on the Morgantown campus has steadily grown, and with State funding, the School of Nursing is expanding across West Virginia. Nursing supports our land-grant mission by training vital medical professionals for the state and region.

NEUROSCIENCE

Neuroscience graduate students in the School of Medicine are at the epicenter of neuroscience research through the world-renowned WVU Rockefeller Neuroscience Institute. Students conduct research with faculty mentors whose world-changing work was recently featured on "60 Minutes" and in the Washington Post and New York Times.





WE R1: WHERE RESEARCH HAPPENS

WVU research spans the spectrum from cosmology to mycology, from creating new works to studying ancient ones and from maximizing artificial intelligence to community development.



- Our experts, with the backing of record-breaking research dollars solve problems of both immediate and longterm impact. Indeed, WVU received \$260 million in research funding, making it the third highest year of giving in the University's history.
- It's why WVU is R1, 1 of only 187 colleges and universities to reach the pinnacle of research activity as ranked by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education.
- Trailblazers like astrophysicists
 Duncan Lorimer and Maura McLaughlin
 contribute to that world-class research
 reputation. The couple discovered fast
 radio bursts, mysterious blasts in the
 skies that can emit as much energy
 as the sun puts out in 3 days. Their
 colleagues, too, are pushing the limits
 of knowledge across the universe by
 detecting gravitational waves from
 the beginning to today, confirming
 Einstein's theory of relativity.
- Closer to home, water researchers have pioneered ways to extract rare earth elements and critical minerals, which power everything from smartphones to the nation's missile guidance system, from acid mine drainage and coal sludge. This innovation could change the game for the domestic economy, environment, and national security.

- Speaking of security, WVU is the FBI's lead academic partner in biometrics research, a relationship dating back to 2008. And our forensics program is 1 of the most comprehensive, with the distinction of being 1 of only 2 in the U.S. to offer bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees. This is bolstered by WVU having the largest crime scene training complex in the country.
- Tucked away in the hills of Appalachia, WVU is also rich in the humanities. Our experts have earned prestigious awards and fellowships to research a range of topics such as political attitudes from mining communities, the history of the American women's movement, and election integrity in Appalachia.
- And while we're engaged in the now and where we've been, we've got all eyes on the future with ambitious endeavors in artificial intelligence, robotics, and energy and sustainability.
- In research, WVU has a storied history in forging paths and breaking boundaries, oftentimes uncovering more unknowns to unravel. As Mountaineers, our natural curiosity and quest for answers will keep us trekking. This is where research happens.

WVU Medicine

The WVU Health System is the state's largest health system and largest private employer with 25 hospitals across the state and 3 Health Sciences campuses. WVU Medicine has grown exponentially over the past several years, adding hospitals and other facilities, expanding services to more areas, increasing healthcare accessibility, and creating new jobs in West Virginia.

Ranked as the #1 hospital in West Virginia by U.S. News & World Report, the flagship J.W. Ruby Memorial Hospital in Morgantown will soon feature a new, state-of-the-art, comprehensive cancer center. The WVU Cancer Institute aims to achieve a National Cancer Institute Designation, a first for West Virginia.

To further accelerate growth and infuse West Virginia with new healthcare facilities, the WVU Health System is investing nearly \$400 million across the state to continue to provide quality healthcare to the region.

INVESTING IN THE FUTURE: WVU Foundation

The WVU Foundation is an independent 501(c)(3) tax-exempt charitable organization. To enrich the lives of those touched by WVU, the Foundation maximizes private charitable support and provides services to the University and its affiliated organizations. In fiscal year 2025, over 22,000 donors gave \$260.7 million to the University, making it the third-highest year of giving in WVU's history. Gifts like these will make a positive impact across the Mountain State and beyond for years to come.




ALMOST HEAVEN

Renowned for breathtaking views, this is a go-to spot for hiking, biking, rock climbing, and zip-lining.


New River Gorge National Park (90 miles away):


